JD students read courses with prefix LCJ (compulsory course) and LLJ (elective course). Courses in green are taught year-long and courses in blue are electives. Some compulsory courses must be read in the earlier semesters as they are prerequisites to other courses.

Students may apply to substitute compulsory courses with elective courses if they have read courses with overlapping content in their LLB or equivalent qualifications. Approval is at the Faculty's discretion. Write to lawgrad@nus.edu.sg before Year 1/1st semester to enquire.

- Year-long courses are taught over two semesters and the course units will be split across both semesters. Year-long courses must be read from Semester 1 of an academic year.
- Students will be automatically enrolled for LCJ5009 Pro Bono Service from Year 1 or 1st Semester of study and are expected to complete the requirements by Year 2 or 4th Semester of study:
 - In the first three semesters of study, the course will be graded 'IP' if it remains incomplete or 'CS' upon completion.
 - From the 4th semester of study, the course will be graded 'CU' if it remains incomplete or 'CS' upon completion.
 - Students will not be able to graduate if the course is graded 'CU' by the end of the graduating semester, even if they have completed the other requirements.
- Students are only allowed to complete up to 86 units of courses and will be required to drop any courses in excess.
