

##: NUS will adopt new academic terminologies from 1 August 2023 - “Module” will be renamed “Course”, “Modular Credit (MC)” will be renamed “Unit”. The definition of a Module/Course and MC/Unit will remain the same.

## Schedule of 3-Year JD Programme WEF AY2021/2022 (as at 21 July 2023)

For the 3-Year JD, the total units of 120-124<sup>^</sup> will have to be completed. Each 4-unit compulsory course is 36 contact hours. A 5-unit elective course is 36 contact hours. All 8-unit compulsory and elective courses are 72 contact hours. An intensive elective course, designated as 4-unit and taught over 3 weeks by visiting professors, is 27 contact hours.

\*\* It is recommended that a student reads Legal Systems of Asia (LSA). However, if a student does not read LSA, the student may read an appropriate Civil Law Elective course in Year 2 Semester 1. It should be noted that the prerequisites for some Civil Law Electives stipulate the completion of core compulsory courses such as Company Law. Students should consult the Director of the JD Programme when in doubt. All students must complete at least one Civil Law Elective course as a graduation requirement.

\*\*\* If a student has read a Civil Law Elective course in Year 2 Semester 1, the student may read any Law Elective course instead, ensuring that the student completes sufficient courses to graduate at the end of Year 3.

<sup>^</sup> A student should complete a total of 120-124 units from the 1st to 6th semesters. If there are excess units, student will be required to drop the additional course/s.
