^ 1. 4-year LL.B. students are allowed to register for *17-23 credits of elective modules per semester. The total number of credits of elective modules per candidature is a range of 72-76. The total number of credits for the LL.B. degree including the 88 credits of compulsory modules must fall within a range of 160-164. Students will need to adjust their credits of elective modules accordingly if they are reading compulsory modules. Students should indicate the total number of law credits required in the semester including compulsory (if any) in the online registration system. Eg. If you are reading 8 credits of compulsory module in a particular semester, you are required to select a range of 20-23 credits in the online registration system. As such, you will only be allocated with no more than 15 credits of elective modules.

^ 2. All students must complete at least one law elective module from "Civil Law" cluster list.
