^ 1. 4-year LLB students are allowed to register for 17-23 credits of modules per semester in the semesters they read elective modules. The total number of credits of elective modules per candidature is a range of 64-68. The total number of credits for the LLB degree including the 96 credits of compulsory modules must fall within a range of 160-164.

2. All students must complete at least one law elective module from "Civil Law" cluster list.

3. Students may read up to 40MC of non-law elective modules.

The limit on the number of Level-1000 modules to be counted towards fulfillment of graduation requirements is 60 MCs, including compulsory modules.
